



Lets Talk About [] Week 5 Discussion Questions

Breaking the Ice:

What is the most outrageous (stupid, questionable or illegal) thing you did as a teen? Any consequences?

Scripture: Colossians 1:10-14

Discussion Questions:

1. What impacts you the most from what God has blessed you with? (Love/Inheritance/Light/ Salvation/etc.)
2. Do these lead to freedom or are we in bondage? Are these blessings or curses? Why?

Read Isaiah 14:12-16 7 Genesis 3:1-4

3. What was Satan up to? Good idea or bad idea?
4. What are the attributes of God? Do these describe you in anyway?
5. Has anyone accused you of being the center of the universe? Being in charge?

Read Genesis 2:15-17, Proverbs 5:18, Proverbs 6:27-29, Mark 9:47 & Job 31:1

6. How is your attitude around women?

Read Psalms 24:1, Malachi 3:10, 1 Timothy 6:10 & Matthew 23:23

7. Exactly what does God own?
8. How much of that is ours?

Take Away:

God desires to give us good things, to bless us, to love us and to be in relationship with us. The “restrictions” are to keep us from doing the outrageous (stupid, questionable or illegal) things that will destroy us and those around us.

Read Matthew 7:13-14 & Matthew 5:8**Prayer Requests:**

Remind the group about confidentiality. Ask the group to break into pairs, this will allow a more open sharing on a personal level. Share with each other if there is an area discussed that you are struggling with, then, pray for each other. Commit to hold each other up in prayer for what was shared. Come back together to pray for the concerns of the group. Remember to pray for each other during the week.

Leader Notes:

Transparent leadership fosters group discussion, so be open to the group with your own struggles. (No bragging, this is not a competition.) We all have our sin areas so the leader needs to model acceptance and forgiveness. Lift up and walk with your group members - be the servant hands and feet of Jesus. The goal of every Life Group is to grow closer to each other by providing an environment of safe interaction. When we foster a culture that promotes transparency and growth we have succeeded in meeting the goal of living life in community. It is never the goal to finish all of the questions, we are there to draw out the group so that each individual can grow in their relationships with one another and most importantly can grow in their relationship with God.
