



## God Never Said That I Part One I Discussion Questions

### Breaking the Ice:

Have a bowl of assorted candy bars, instruct each person to select one. After they have picked, ask them to go around the circle and tell how something in their life is similar to that candy bar. For example: My life is like this Milky Way because I believe what God has for me is unlimited. I believe that he is preparing me to make a difference in this world.

**Scripture:** John 14:5-7

### Discussion Questions:

1. Have you ever misquoted the bible? ie: "God **never** gives us more than we can handle?" If so, is it ok? Does it really do harm to attribute things to the bible that it doesn't contain?
2. Does it matter what you believe? Or as some people think, it doesn't matter what you believe, just be true to what you believe, because all roads lead to heaven. Do all roads lead to heaven?
3. Why does the name of "Jesus" cause such division? What did Jesus claim that was so controversial?
4. Jesus offers forgiveness of sins through faith not through works. What does that mean to you? Why does that astound and infuriate his detractors?
5. For what reason did Jesus come to the earth? Who was Jesus targeting?

### Take Away:

How well do you know the word of God? Contemplate this week your need to know what the bible truly says and how to confront common misconceptions attributed to the bible.

### Prayer Requests:

Share and record your group's prayer requests. Take time to pray together and make the prayer requests available to the group so you can continue to pray for one another throughout the week.
